We also still have an amazing selection of indoor and outdoor plants provided by the Propagation facility. Our sales have been great and we are very grateful to all our volunteers for all their time and hard work in keeping the information centre open.

# **KEEN TO BE A VOLUNTEER? WE NEED YOU!**

We have known for some time that we need more volunteers for the Information Centre and over the summer season, especially December and January, it has been a challenge some days to have people available to staff the Centre. We have been especially busy on cruise ship days and ideally we need two people per 3 hour shift. It is not just volunteers taking holidays that affects our numbers but also school holidays bring child-minding commitments for many, which reduces their time availability.

We plan to have a gathering some time in February to let potential volunteers know what our role is in the Information Centre and explain some of the tasks we carry out. The opening hours are from 10.00 am to 4.00 pm and we divide this into two 3-hour shifts – 10.00 am to 1.00 pm and 1.00 pm to 4.00 pm. Being able to work one shift a week is great but some of our volunteers only work every second week and some once a month so we are grateful for whatever commitment people are able to give.

The duties of these rangers are:

- -To enforce garden by-laws
- -Be a deterrent for disorderly behaviour
- -Assist visitors with queries

Both rangers are first aid trained so are the first port of call for any medical emergencies. The Rangers are the only Botanic garden staff on site at the weekends and public holidays apart from the Duty person, therefore are responsible for any issues or emergencies. They will also unlock and close the information centre, and help out in the centre during busy periods.
